

A 'DAISY IN A JAR' BOOK LAUNCH

Jorie Ryan lives in Mudgee, New South Wales. She has written poetry as far back as she can remember and loves the music and beauty of words. Her poetry explores relationships - to each other, to the natural world and to God. Her poems bear witness to a world that is both beautiful and confusing. Jorie has published four books and has appeared in numerous journals.

"While it can be risky to judge a book by its cover, this is not the case with Jorie Ryan's most recent collection of poems, A Daisy in a Jar. The simple beauty of the yellow daisy in its repurposed glass jar against a deep blue background is a fitting image for what Jorie is endeavouring to do in these poems. At one level, these are accessible poems about the consolations and challenges of ordinary life through

its seasons of belonging, dislocation and homecoming. Never far away is the poet's search for identity, for the deeper meaning of her life within some larger story. This is a hopeful book. While not avoiding times of personal difficulty, or concerns about what is happening in the wider world – ecological and pandemic issues, for example - Jorie does not linger there. Describing herself as 'the dreamer, the optimistic traveller', she readily finds herself delighted and consoled by natural beauty or the satisfactions of tending a home, a garden or a relationship. Never pious or preachy, and often playful, these poems are like a spiritual practice helping the poet to find her way home. In this sense, A Daisy in a Jar is a pilgrim memoir." MUDGEE MEN'S SHED Working Together for Mudgee Men's Future

What is Mudgee Men's Shed?

There's nothing new about men gathering together in their own space to talk, share skills, swap ideas, solve problems or just discuss life in general – it's been happening since the beginning of time. There's nothing new either about men spending time in their backyard shed – an acknowledged Aussie pastime.

What is new is that men, particularly retired men, are combining these two activities in a communal space simply called a "Men's Shed". What is also new is how strongly men have embraced this new identity – being a member of a Men's Shed. Men's Sheds, as such, are a peculiarly Australian phenomenon. In the past decade a wide range of community-based Men's Sheds has sprung up – each with its own unique identity and purpose.

Activities within sheds are many and various: woodwork, metal work, restoration of old cars, community projects, portable sheds taken to Alzheimer facilities or mobile sheds for remote country areas. The membership is diverse too. Men of all ages from all backgrounds, ethnic and social mixes can enjoy a Men's Shed, bringing their unique cultural characteristics to enliven the activities.

The common theme in all Sheds is about men feeling useful and contributing again to their communities, learning or sharing their skills, making friends, networking and availing themselves of health information programmes and opportunities. Men's Sheds are under the auspices of a variety of organisations whose ethos they tend to exemplify.

Communities are keen to provide activity, identity and meaning for vast numbers of older, unemployed, job-redundant, 'downsized', isolated, depressed and happily retired, active, creative, enthusiastic men. Men's Sheds are fast being recognized as vital, viable places to fulfill these needs and provide relaxed, happy creative spaces for men to enjoy.

Benefits of Mudgee Men's Shed

- The shed encourages male atmosphere for all men that feel that they can network and talk to each other.
- The shed encourages improved health and lifestyle by addressing issues such as isolation, loneliness or depression.
- Men learn, master or teach new skills.

MUDGEE ARTS PRECINCT'S LATEST EXHBITION

Mating Dance by Anna-Wili Highfield

Born in 1980, Anna-Wili studied fine art at the National Art School, Sydney and worked for many years as a scenic artist for Opera Australia, before establishing herself independently as a practising artist. Her remarkable sculptures are held in private collections around the world and have featured in numerous publications, including the *New York Times* and *Sculpture Review*, USA.

The largest commercial collection of Anna-Wili's work is held by luxury French fashion brand Hermès, with her well renowned solo exhibitions including Animals at Carriageworks, Sydney, Spirit Faces, Olsen Gruin Gallery New York City, and Companions, Olsen Gallery Sydney.

The exhibition is a celebration of Australia's principal dancing bird - the brolga, and features unique sculptures sewn from waxed cotton of the Australian native birds suspended like marionettes in courtship formations. Composer and musician Bree Van Reyk has created an accompanying sound piece which will intermittently join the dancing birds with instrumentals inspired by the brolga's bold trumpeting.

Anna-Wili first exhibited *Mating Dance* at Glasshouse Regional Gallery, Port Macquarie where she spent time drawing inspiration from the abundant birdlife within the lands of the Dunghutti and Birpai people. The exhibition now travels to another place of significance, with the brolga known to inhabit the Mid-

Western Region on the lands of the Wiradjuri people.

Contributing artist Bree van Reyk is a drummer, percussionist, composer and sound artist who lives and works on Gagigal, Bidjigal and Awabakal lands. Bree has forged a unique career playing and recording with the likes of Gurrumul, Emma Donovan and Paul Kelly, as well as the Australian Chamber Orchestra with commissions by Sydney Symphony Orchestra, Sydney Chamber Orchestra and the Museum of Contemporary Art.

The exhibition aims to choreograph a moment in nature in a way that emphasises a shared spirit between humans and animals.

Mating Dance by Anna-Wili Highfield will close 18 September. Mudgee Arts Precinct is open seven days a week from 9am to 5pm. Entry is free.



In the trial rings, we will see some of the cleverest dogs and handlers from all over NSW competing. In the obedience rings, there will be heelwork, retrieving, jumping and scenting amongst the numerous exercises to be undertaken. Each level of competition gradually increases in difficulty as the dogs attain a prescribed number of passes to gain a title at each level, progressing from "Community Companion Dog" to "Companion Dog" to "Companion Dog Excellent" to "Utility Dog" and finally, the most difficult level; "Utility Dog Excellent".

The club will also be holding rally trials, where the handler and dog makes their way through a course of signs where they are to undertake an exercise at each sign as indicated. Like obedience, there are a number of levels of difficulty associated with each title that can be achieved, starting with "Rally Novice", progressing to "Rally Advanced" then to "Rally Excellent" and finally "Rally Masters".


During winter, people benefit from better nutrition through resistance to illness, an emotional boost against "cabin fever" and better management of overall health conditions.

Cook a larger pot of a recipe and divide into smaller portions to freeze. Meal prep doesn't need to be hard, it should be convenient and easy. 

\$130,000 TO RESURFACE THE GULGONG TENNIS COURTS!

They may be more than 10,000 kms away from Wimbledon, but Gulgong Tennis Courts will soon be grand slam ready, with plans underway for a \$130,000 upgrade of the surface thanks to the former Coalition government.

The current concrete surface has seen better days, with large cracks snaking across the courts. Thanks to this funding, a high-performance, synthetic grass surface is on the way!

The new synthetic grass surface will be perfect for fastpaced play, while being a little easier on the joints, not so rough on one's tennis shoes, a bit cooler during summertime matches, and will be a breeze to maintain.

For the last six years, the Gulgong and District Tennis Association have been rallying to turn the much-loved local courts into a top-notch tennis facility. With planning underway to install the new tennis surfaces, the next Goolas



underway to install the new tennis surfaces, the next Goolagong could very well be from Gulgong!

The funding is through the former Coalition Government's Locals Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

AUSTRALIA'S FOREIGN RELATIONS IN FOCUS

NEW ZEALAND - While we love the kiwis (except when they beat us in any type of sport) the idea floated recently by the Australian and New Zealand Prime Ministers that New Zealanders who are living and working here, but are not citizens, should get the right to vote in Australian elections is not on.

Whether New Zealand gives non-citizens the right to vote shouldn't make any difference. I think it's pretty simple - if you want to vote in an Australian election, take the step of becoming an Australian citizen.

FRANCE - I was very pleased to see that the new Federal Government has mended fences with our important friend and ally, France. The friendship between Australia and France is a story of shared service and sacrifice. The friendship is as strong as it is deep. France is also an important partner in keeping peace and security in the Indo-Pacific. I support our switch from conventionally powered submarines to nuclear powered vessels but the reality is that the change could have been handled better in terms of our relationship with the French. It's important that our long friendship with France continues.

CHINA - Our largest trading partner is China. It is in our interests to have a strong and productive relationship with China. The people to people relationships between our two countries are still very strong. China has previously listed 14 grievances that needed to be addressed before relations could be resumed.

These grievances included the freedom of the press, and MPs being free to speak their minds. Agreeing to those terms was never acceptable to the Australian Government.

The Chinese Government has recently come up with 4 new conditions before relationships can be normalised. They are: 1. Australia must treat China "as a partner rather than a rival". 2. Countries must seek "common ground while reserving differences". 3. Australia must reject "being controlled by any third party". 4. Build "positive and pragmatic social foundations and public support".

Friendship between nations needs to be built on mutual trust and respect. Issuing a list of demands does not promote this. The demands essentially state that if there is to be a friendship it will be on China's terms. The reference to control by a third party is a reference to Australia's alliance with the United States. The demand relating to building public support featuring positiveness and pragmatism is again aimed at muting criticism of China either through the media or our MPs. The reference to "reserving differences" means that China does not want to hear any criticism of its human rights record or other activities including economic coercion and trying to build military bases in the Pacific.

As I have said, it's important to have a strong and healthy relationship with China, but it can't be a relationship at any price or on terms that compromise Australia's interests or values. These latest 4 demands are not a step in the right direction.


